WHEREAS, the Friends of the Detroit River Committee (Committee) has made application for, wishes to conduct its annual 2012 Detroit River Classic Run (Event) within the boundaries, and on the streets of the City of Trenton on June 9, 2012, ("the event"); and

WHEREAS, such use involves making arrangements with, and obtaining certain designations and approvals from, various local agencies, including the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Trenton, that the use of certain below referenced City streets for the EVENT is hereby approved for Saturday, June 9, 2012, upon the terms and conditions set forth herein.

BE IT FURTHERED RESOLVED, that the Event is designated as a "Special Event" pursuant to Trenton Ordinance No. 537 of 1994 (the "Ordinance"), is subject to the rules and regulations associated with a special event, and that the below referenced street and highway surfaces be subject to the provisions of the Ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Parks System be requested to prohibit traffic in Elizabeth Park from 6:30 a.m. until the conclusion of the Race and grant permission to the City of Trenton to close the following streets to vehicular traffic on that date:

- A. West Road between Third and West Jefferson, from 6:30 a.m., while the race is in progress, until 10:30 a.m.
- B. West Jefferson south of West Road to Elizabeth Park, and north of West Road to Truax, while the race is in progress, until 10:30 a.m.; and
- C. Truck traffic on West Jefferson between Van Horn and King Roads, from 6:30 a.m., while the race is in progress, until 10:30 a.m.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Trenton shall close the following

City streets to vehicular traffic while the race is in progress on that date from 6:30 a.m. until 10:30 a.m.

- A. Walnut, Maple, St Joseph, Elm, Cherry, Atwood, Harrison, and Truax, from Riverside Drive to West Jefferson.
- B. Slocum from West Jefferson to Elizabeth and Elizabeth from Slocum to Walnut.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Wayne County Regulations, the City of Trenton shall assume liability for any damages which may arise as a result from the use of the above mentioned road closures.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Engineer, William Hogan, P.E., is hereby designated and authorized to sign the road Closure Permit on behalf of the City of Trenton.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Committee shall reimburse the City for all incremental costs incurred by the City associated with the event including but not limited to additional street patrols, erection and removal of traffic control devices, and emergency response services. The Committee shall provide the City with an accounting of all revenues received by category, accompanied by a detailed accounting of its expenses within 30 days following the Event.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that approval of the Event is contingent upon the receiving a deposit against such expenses incurred by the City, in the amount of \$ 1,000.00 prior to the Event, payable in 2 installments of \$ 500.00, which shall be due and payable before the publication of any promotional materials concerning the date and time of the Event, and the balance of \$ 500.00 due no later than May 1, 2012. Failure of the Committee to make either payment in a timely manner shall result in cancellation of the Event and revocation of the permit by City, without liability. A final invoice for City expenses shall be prepared and presented to the Committee within 30 days following the Event, which shall be due and payable to City within 30 days. Failure to make timely payment will result in disqualification of the organization and organizers of the Event from eligibility for conducting future Events, in addition to other remedies available at law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City shall not serve as, or be in any way, construed to be a host, sponsor, organizer, or independent contractor of the Event and that the Committee shall obtain and maintain and provide to the City proof of insurance coverage in the amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.) naming the City of Trenton as a primary insured for the Event, and shall further provide the City with a release, discharge, hold harmless and indemnification against claims, demands, damages, expenses, causes of action, attachments of property, or liability resulting partially or wholly from any act or acts, even any negligent act or omission to act, and including negligent or omitted first-aid or rescue operations or procedures by the City, naming the City, its directors, attorneys, agents, employees, contractors, volunteers, guests and affiliated individuals or organizations of the City as well as elected officials as beneficiaries. The Committee shall further require each participant in the Event to execute a release, discharge, and hold harmless agreement which includes the above mentioned persons and entities as beneficiaries, and shall retain copies for a period of two years from the Event or deliver same to the City for safekeeping.

Ordinance 758, Specific Base Flood Elevation Standards (2nd Rdg)

**CITY OF TRENTON
ORDINANCE NO. 758**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 46-82 OF THE TRENTON CITY CODE ENTITLED "SPECIFIC BASE FLOOD ELEVATION STANDARDS," TO INCORPORATE FEDERAL REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS GOVERNING THE ADEQUACY OF THE FLOOD PLAIN MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS FOR FLOOD-PRONE AREAS.

THE CITY OF TRENTON, COUNTY OF WAYNE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 46-82 of the Trenton City Code entitled "Specific base flood elevation standards" shall be repealed in its entirety and the following shall be substituted in its stead:

Sec. 46-82. - Specific base flood elevation standards.

(a) On the basis of the most recent available base flood elevation data, the following standards shall apply in an area of special flood hazard:

- (1) All new construction and substantial improvements of residential structures shall have the lowest floor, including basement, elevated to or above the base flood level.
- (2) All new construction and substantial improvements of nonresidential structures shall have either:

a. The lowest floor, including basement, elevated to or above the base flood level; or

b. Be constructed such that, below base flood level, together with attendant utility and sanitary facilities, the structure is watertight with walls substantially impermeable to the passage of water and with structural components having the capability of resisting hydrostatic and hydrodynamic loads and effects of buoyancy. A registered professional engineer or architect shall certify that the standards of this subsection are satisfied, and that the floodproofing methods employed are adequate to withstand the flood depths, pressures, velocities, impact and uplift forces and other factors associated with a base flood in the location of the structure. Such certification shall be submitted as provided in division 2 of this article, and shall indicate the elevation to which the structure is floodproofed.

(b) In accordance with CFR Title 44, entitled Emergency Management and Assistance, Part 60.3, regarding Flood plain management criteria for flood-prone areas, the City adopts and incorporates by reference the requirements of CFR 60.3(c), paragraphs (1) through (14) and in accordance with 60.3(d), the most recent base flood elevation data and maps received from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, including the most current flood insurance study (FIS) and flood insurance rate map (FIRM) which shall take precedence over data from other sources where less stringent.

Section 2. **Saving Clause.** Nothing in this Ordinance or in the Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 3. **Severability.** Should any word, sentence, phrase or any portion of this Ordinance be held in a manner invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction or by any state agency having authority to do so for any reason whatsoever, such holdings shall be construed and limited to such work, sentence, phrase or any portion of the Ordinance held to be so invalid shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining words, sentences, phrases or portions of this Ordinance.

Section 4. **Conflicting Ordinances.** All prior existing ordinances adopted by the City of Trenton inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, hereby expressly repealed.

Section 5. **Readings.** This Ordinance shall be given a first reading on January 9, 2012 shall be enacted on January 23, 2012, and shall be published on or before January 29, 2012 and shall be effective January 30, 2012.

ADOPTED, APPROVED AND PASSED by the City Council of the City of Trenton this 23rd day of January, 2012.

Ordinance 760, Fire Department Vacancies (1st Rdg)

**CITY OF TRENTON
ORDINANCE NO. 760**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 42 ENTITLED "FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION", ARTICLE II, , DIVISION 2, SECTION 42-62 OF THE TRENTON CITY CODE ENTITLED "APPOINTMENTS" TO MODIFY AND EXPEDITE THE APPLICATION PROCESS FOR FILLING VACANCIES IN THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND ITS POSTING REQUIREMENTS CONSISTENT WITH RECENT CHARTER REVISIONS.

THE CITY OF TRENTON, COUNTY OF WAYNE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 42-62 of the Trenton City Code entitled "Appointments" shall be repealed in its entirety and the following shall be substituted in its stead:

Sec. 42-62. - Appointments.

- (a) Appointments for employment as officers in the fire department shall only be made after completely fulfilling the preliminary requirements and satisfactory completion of examinations to determine physical and mental fitness. Such examination shall be conducted as provided in this division, and appointments shall be made from a revolving list of qualified applicants after confirmation by the city administrator or mayor.
- (b) Such list of applicants may be held in effect, and continuing appointments made therefrom, for a period of up to two years from the date of application, which may be periodically updated, or terminated earlier if found to be in the best interest of the city by approval of the mayor.
- (c) In the absence or shortage of currently available applicants in the department's revolving file, the fire chief may contact local academies or cause public notice to be given for additional applicants, which notice shall be posted on the city's web-site and cable television or published in the local newspaper carrying official council proceedings, that applications for appointment and examination are being accepted by the city. Such applications shall be received and kept in a revolving file at the city's human resource office where it shall be periodically updated for eligibility.

Section 2. Saving Clause. Nothing in this Ordinance or in the Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 3. Severability. Should any word, sentence, phrase or any portion of this Ordinance be held in a manner invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction or by any state agency having authority to do so for any reason whatsoever, such holdings shall be construed and limited to such work, sentence, phrase or any portion of the Ordinance held

to be so invalid shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining words, sentences, phrases or portions of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Conflicting Ordinances. All prior existing ordinances adopted by the City of Trenton inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, hereby expressly repealed.

Readings. This Ordinance shall be given a first reading on January 23, 2012 shall be enacted on February 6, 2012, and shall be published on or before February 19, 2012 and shall be effective February 20, 2012.
