Ordinance 716, Update to Emergency Medical Services Fees (2nd Rdg)

CITY OF TRENTON

ORDINANCE NO. 716

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CERTAIN SECTIONS OF A-9 ENTITLED “EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES” OF APPENDIX A OF THE CITY CODE FOR PURPOSES OF UPDATING FEES AND CHARGES TO CORRESPOND TO REIMBURSEMENT LEVELS.

THE CITY OF TRENTON, COUNTY OF WAYNE, HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Sec. A-9 of Appendix A of the Trenton City Code entitled “Emergency Medical Services” shall be modified to update the City’s fees and charges for certain medical transport services, which shall read as follows:

Sec. A-9. Emergency Medical Services.

The following fees shall be assessed to and paid by any person utilizing the services of an emergency vehicle owned or operated by the City for purposes of transporting that person to a facility for emergency medical treatment:

- (1) Basic ambulance service..... \$425.00
- (2) Advance life support system (1)..... \$600.00
- (3) Advance life support system (2 – intensive).....\$725.00
- (3) Reimbursement for mileage..... \$9.50/mile
- (4) Reimbursement to City for extrication equipment..... \$500.00
- (5) Reimbursement to City for oxygen treatment.....\$50.00

Section 2. Saving Clause. Nothing in this Ordinance or in the Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 3. Severability. Should any word, sentence, phrase or any portion of this Ordinance be held in a manner invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction or by any state agency having authority to do so for any reason whatsoever, such holdings shall be construed and limited to such work, sentence, phrase or any portion of the Ordinance held to be so invalid shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining words, sentences, phrases or portions of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Conflicting Ordinances. All prior existing ordinances adopted by the City of Trenton inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, hereby expressly repealed.

Section 5. Readings. This Ordinance shall be given a first reading on January 20, 2009, shall be enacted on February 2, 2009, and shall be published on or before February 8, 2009, and shall be effective February 9, 2009.

Ordinance 717, Obstructing Fire Hydrants (Emergency Reading)

CITY OF TRENTON

ORDINANCE NO. 717

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 42-4 OF THE TRENTON CITY CODE ENTITLED "OBSTRUCTING FIRE HYDRANT" TO HOLD PROPERTY OWNERS AND CONTRACTORS RESPONSIBLE FOR PERMITTING SNOW AND OTHER DEBRIS TO OBSTRUCT FIRE HYDRANTS.

THE CITY OF TRENTON, COUNTY OF WAYNE, HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Sec. 42.4 of the Trenton City Code entitled "Obstructing Fire Hydrant" shall be amended, and shall read as follows:

Sec. 42-4. Obstructing Fire Hydrant.

- a) No person shall place, or cause to be placed by another, any building materials, plantings, trash, or other obstruction whatsoever, within 15 feet of any fire hydrant in the City; nor shall the owner or occupant of property permit such material, placed on or adjacent to a fire hydrant on their property in violation of the section, to remain there.
- b) No person shall place, or cause to be placed by another, snow on or around any fire hydrant in the City so as to obstruct immediate access by fire officials; nor shall the owner or occupant of property permit snow placed on or adjacent to a fire hydrant on their property in violation of this section, to remain there for a period in excess of 12 hours.
- c) Any person on whose property such obstructions to a fire hydrant exists, shall have an affirmative duty to immediately remove or relocate the obstruction to afford ready access to the hydrant.
- d) Whenever the chief of the fire department shall deem such material to be an access obstruction which potentially endangers fire and rescue operations and requires immediate abatement, he may order the department to undertake such abatement at the owners expense, reimbursement for which shall be made within 30 days.

- e) Violations of this section shall constitute a municipal civil infraction with a minimum penalty of \$ 50.00 per day per violation.

Section 2. **Saving Clause.** Nothing in this Ordinance or in the Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 3. **Severability.** Should any word, sentence, phrase or any portion of this Ordinance be held in a manner invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction or by any state agency having authority to do so for any reason whatsoever, such holdings shall be construed and limited to such work, sentence, phrase or any portion of the Ordinance held to be so invalid shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining words, sentences, phrases or portions of this Ordinance.

Section 4. **Conflicting Ordinances.** All prior existing ordinances adopted by the City of Trenton inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, hereby expressly repealed.

Section 5. **Readings.** This Ordinance shall be given immediate effect as an emergency Ordinance, pursuant to Section 7.3 of the City's Charter.
