CITY OF TRENTON

Background and History

- One of only 6 communities in Wayne County that does NOT offer or provide curbside recycling
- Issue previously visited as recent as 2016
- We provide trash collection in house
- Directed by Council to address issue



Current Status

- Drop off Center
- No Curbside Pick up



Start up Costs and Considerations

- Need Dedicated Truck
- ► Need Carts (6700) or so
- Need Truck operator (new employee)
- Need to heavily educate residents
- Need to set money aside for sustainability (Capital purchases above)

Assumptions

- ► In house (there does not appear to be any appetite for outsourcing trash)
- Bi-weekly collection
- Increase recycle collection tonnage about 9 fold
- Plan needs to be sustainable
- Plan needs to be affordable and inclusionary
- Assumes 60-70% will actually recycle (national average)
- Assumes 10 pounds of recyclables per week (national average)

Plan Overview

- Acquire new truck (\$290K)
- Acquire Carts (\$410k)
- Hire additional employee
- Educate residents
- Implement July 1st, 2022





New Truck

- Purchase new truck, \$290,000.
- Plan for truck to last at least 6 years
- Set aside at least \$50k a year from revenue to replace truck
- 8 month delivery
- Would be branded and labeled to make it obviously a Recycle truck



Purchase Carts

- > 96 Gallon Carts
- **6650**
- > \$412k delivered





Annual Budget

Estimated Annual Costs	
Truck (life of 6 years)	\$ 50,000
Cart replacements	10,000
Tipping fees	151,000
Laborer & Benefits	72,112
Fuel plus R&M	10,000
Education & Advertising	10,000
Annual	\$ 303,112
Monthly Costs	\$ 25,259

How do we pay for it?

Monthly fee per household of \$5.50 (\$3 for seniors over 65)

Revenue needed is projected to be \$25,259

Expenses/Revenue

Excess revenue held for related expenses, Rate adjusted annually per Council

Monthly Rate	5.50
Seniors Rate (65 and over)	3.00
Monthly Revenue	
Revenue from Senior Citizen households	\$6,584
Revenue from NON Senior Citizen households	\$23,408

TOTAL Monthly Revenue	\$29,992

Now we know it is sustainable.....but what about the start up costs?

Carts and Truck....big investment!

- Truck and Carts (290k and \$412k)
- ► Total cash outlay \$702,000
- ► EGLE Grant and The Recycling Partnership Grant will cover \$598,000
- Trenton will need to cover approximately \$104-110,000.
- These monies will be recouped easily during the first year of operation

Options (based on grants)

- Option A
 - Assumes Grants approved
 - Assumes truck and cart purchase
 - Capital Outlay for City approximately \$110,000

- Option B
 - Assumes EGLE grant rejected and Recycle Partnership is approved
 - Shift budgeted trash truck to Recycle truck (\$290,000)
 - ► Recycle Grant (covers \$110,000)
 - Capital Outlay for City approximately \$312,000

Summary of options

- Option A (grants approved) Net investment for City \$110,000
- Option B (EGLE Grants rejected/defer truck purchase) Net investment for City \$312,000
- Option C (EGLE Grant rejected, no truck deferral) Net Investment for City \$600,000
- Option D Do nothing
